# **Yohimbe**

Latin name: Pausinystalia yohimbe

Family: Rubiaceae

## Miscellaneous:

• Available as a prescription drug known as yohimbine HCl (Yohimex<sup>TM</sup>, Yocon®), both of which have fewer side effects than the natural herb.

 Studies have indicated that the majority of commercial products are clearly inadequate with respect to quality.<sup>1</sup>

•  $\approx$  6% of total constituents found within the herb comprise an alkaloid mixture. The primary constituent of this mixture is yohimbine.

#### Hees

Erectile dysfunction.

## Mechanism:

Yohimbine is an  $\alpha_2$ -adrenergic antagonist. This leads to a peripheral decrease in adrenergic and increase in cholinergic activity.<sup>1</sup> This action of increasing cholinergic activity is thought to be related to erectile function.

\*Pharmacokinetic dilemmas exist with regard to drug absorption. Recent studies are indicative of ideal absorption following oral administration on an empty stomach. <sup>1</sup>

# Contraindications/Side effects:

Tremors, nausea, severe hypotension, hypertension, tachycardia, and abdominal distress.
